Are you prepared?

Hurricane Preparedness

Hurricane season runs from June 1- November 30. Because we are a low-density area, we tend to get our service back late. Here are some tips to help you prepare so you can go through this season safely.

Consumables

- 1 gal of water/person/day for at least 3 days. For a family of 5, this would be 15 gallons.
- Long shelf-life foods like oatmeal, pasta, canned goods, MREs,

or Freeze-dried foods

- 2-week supply of medications for you and your pets
- 3-day supply of food and water for your pets

Hardware, Misc.

- Gas or propane-powered generator
- Pet necessities such as litter or shavings
- Flashlights with batteries or solar-powered lamps
- Emergency radio with a crank or solar power
- Download The NOAA Weather Radio App and the Red Cross Emergency App to your mobile device
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape
- First aid kit

To Do list NOW

- Clean rain gutters
- Clear drainage areas
- Trim trees and shrubs that might damage buildings. If the vegetation is near a power line, you can report the issue to FPL through their **Vegetation Request** page.

To Do list JUST BEFORE THE STORM

- Fill vehicle gas tanks
- Secure objects that could be blown around

The first Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday will run from June 1 to June 14 and again August 24 to September 6, 2024. This **Tax Information Publication** details the purchase allowances.

Please be advised that waste piles identified as exceeding the permissible size for regular pick-up must be promptly removed. Failure to do so may pose a hazard to both individuals and the community in the event of a hurricane. What is the difference between a hurricane watch and a hurricane warning?

A watch means hurricane conditions are possible in the next 48 hours while a warning means hurricane force conditions are expected within 36 hours or less.

Will you shelter-in-place or evacuate?

If you live in a structurally sound home and are not in a mandatory evacuation zone, shelter-in-place may be the best option for you. Self evacuating can be stressful, expensive and do more harm than good. Be sure you have prepared your food, water and emergency supply stocks.

If you are given orders or choose to evacuate, don't wait until the storm arrives and it is too dangerous to travel. If you are going to a local hurricane shelter, all you need to know can be found here **Public Safety - Emergency Management Shelters**

Remember, if you need to evacuate to a shelter, in most cases your pet cannot accompany you. There are 2 exceptions:

- Service animals for people with disabilities is the first.
- There is a **Pet Friendly Shelter** inside the West Boynton Recreation Center. Space is limited and preregistration is required. Follow the link for more information.

You may want to coordinate in advance with a neighbour or friend to care for your pet if you must evacuate.

Pumpkin Recipes

pumpkin bread

- INGREDIENTS
- 2 CUPS CANNED PUMPKIN PUREE 3 CUPS WHITE SUGAR
- CUP VEGETABLE OIL
- 4 EGGS 2/3 CUP WATER
- 1.5 TEASPOON PUMPKIN PIE SPICE OR NUTMEG 1.5 TEASPOONS SALT 2 TEASPOONS CINNAMON

3 1/3 CUPS WHITE FLOUR 2 TEASPOONS BAKING SODA

- DIRECTIONS 1. PREHEAT OVEN TO 350 DEGREES F. COMBINE PUMPKIN, SUGAR, OIL, WATER, AND EGGS IN A LARGE MIXING BOWL AND MIX WELL.
- CARDO MIXING BOWL AND MIXING SODA, SALT, CINNAMON, AND PUMPKIN PIE SPICE IN A MEDIUM MIXING BOWL, GRADUALLY ADD THE DRY INGREDIENTS TO THE WET INGREDIENTS IN THE LARGE BOWL OF PUMPKIN MIXTURE. USE A HAND MIXER TO MIX OR MAKE SURE TO STIR WELL SO THAT EVERYTHING IS COMPLETELY COMBINED.
- 3 GENEROUSLY SPRAY TWO 8X4 NONSTICK LOAF PANS WITH COOKING SPRAY, POUR 3. GENEROUSLES SPART 1700 844 NORS FICE LOAP PARS WITH COOKING SPRAT. POUR MIXTURE EVENLY INTO PANS, FILLING THE LOAP PAR UP TO 3/4 OF THE WAY FULL. (DO NOT OVERFILL THE PARS.)
 4. BAKE AT 350 DEGREES FOR 45 TO 55 MINUTES, OR UNTIL DONE. BREAD WILL BE DONE
- WHEN A TOOTHPICK INSERTED IN THE CENTER OF THE BREAD LOAF COMES OUT CLEAN. DO NOT OVERBAKE

Prep: 10 mins Cook: 0 mins Chill Time: 2 hrs 30 mins Total: 2 hrs 40 mins Servings: 8 servings

Ingredients 8 ounces cream cheese, softened 1 cup pumpkin puree, or squash puree 1/2 cup light brown sugar, packed 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger 2 1/2 cups regular or light frozen whipped topping, thawed (most of an 8-ounce tub) 1 (9-inch) graham cracker crust (purchased or homemade) Whipped topping, or sweetened whipped cream, for garnish Cinnamon sugar, for sprinkling, optional

Steps to make it 1. Gather the ingredients.

- 2. In a mixing bowl with an electric mixer, beat the cream cheese with the pumpkin or squash puree, brown sugar, pure vanilla extract, cinnamon, nutmeg, and ginger, until well blended and fluffy.
- 3. Fold in the 21/2 cups whipped topping. 4. Spread the mixture in the graham cracker crust.
- 5. Cover and chill the pie for 2 to 3 hours before serving. 6. Serve with whipped topping or sweetened

whipped cream and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar, if desired.

Recipe For: Pumpkin Soup

Ingredients:

- 2 sugar pie pumpkins cut meat cut up into chunks (no skin)
- 4 cups water
- 4 bouillon cubes
- 2 cloves garlic

1 onion, sliced ¾ cups milk (any kind)

Directions:

Add raw pumpkin meat (cut into chunks with no skin) to pot. Add all other ingredients to pot. Bring to a boil and then simmer for about 2 hours (until cooked down about ½ way). Allow to cool down some and then

blend fully in blender. Stir in ¾ cups milk and serve warm or cold!
